

Countywide Climate Change Survey

In Spring 2025, Chelan County community members participated in a survey on climate change to share what they are seeing, concerned about, and what ideas they have to help our communities stay strong and adaptable. Over 200 people responded, with around 70% saying they believe climate change is affecting the county in some way. Many respondents provided written feedback that informed the major themes below.

What are Chelan County residents most concerned about?

Weather changes: Less winter snow, lower snowpack, hotter summers, and drier seasons, impacting outdoor activities and agriculture.

Wildfires and smoke: Increased wildfires and smoke have been noted, resulting in longer fire seasons, health issues, and disruptions to recreation and farming.

Drought and water issues: Concerns about drought and decreasing water supply for irrigation and ecosystems were common, affecting local agriculture and fish populations.

Health and quality of life: Extreme heat, smoke, and changing precipitation negatively impacted outdoor activities, mental health, and overall quality of life.

Economic impacts: Climate change-related issues, like rising insurance costs and the need for funding, are causing financial strain.

Nature and wildlife: Declining bird populations, changes in plant timing, and tree die-offs due to heat and drought, raising biodiversity concerns.



Q2 How long have you lived in Chelan County?







Q5 How informed do you feel about the impacts of climate change on Chelan County?




Q6 How concerned are you about natural hazards when you think about the future?







Q11 What resources or support would help you feel more prepared for climate change impacts? (Select all that apply)











Q19 Which race or ethnicity best describes you?


