## DON'T BE A MESS

## WEAR A VEST

**50% of all boating deaths could be prevented by wearing a life vest.** Rivers are fast, cold and unpredictable — know your take out, watch for “strainers” like plants and logs, and talk with local experts prior to your trip.

## WATCH FOR NESTS

Endangered spring Chinook salmon spawn in the Wenatchee River in late summer. Females use their tail fins to clean dirt from the river beds, and then lay eggs in this nest, called a redd. **Salmon nests look like bright and clean spots in the gravel. August to October, look before you step!**
