PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Icicle and Peshastin Irrigation Districts' (IPID) point of diversion is located on Icicle Creek at RM 5.7. IPID provides water to irrigators outside of the Icicle Creek subbasin, which means all water saved through conservation efforts would benefit Icicle Creek from the point of diversion to the confluence with the Wenatchee.

Based on preliminary estimates, it is believed IPID could achieve 10% water conservation, which would be 10 cfs and 3000 ac-ft. Conservation projects that might be implemented include canal lining or piping and on-farm efficiency upgrades. As part of an effort to evaluate conservation opportunities, IPID will be updating their comprehensive irrigation district conservatin plan.

Updating the management plan and evaluating conservation opportunities is expected to cost \$130,000, with an additional \$7.5 million being planned for conservation improvements.
