Q: Is the noise analysis for highway traffic noise or in water work noise?

A: The noise analysis is for highway traffic noise, as the proposed bridge will be placed in a new location.

Q: Is the hazardous material memorandum a Phase 1 site assessment?

A: No, a Phase 1 site assessment is not required at this time. This investigation will focus on surrounding land uses and detail our project impact or lack of impact to these sites.

Q: Will this be a separate contact or a supplement to the current design contact?

A: This will be a separate, stand-alone Local Agency Standard Consultant Agreement.

Q: Is a discipline report required for Environmental Justice?

A: Not at this time. It is anticipated that because of right-of-way acquisition and detour only a memorandum is required.

Q: Is assistance with right-of-way needed?

A: No, right-of-way is currently managed under a separate contract.

Q: Would it be accurate to say that you are looking for a team with experience providing environmental support for the transportation design?

A: Chelan County Public Works is seeking a team with experience providing environmental support for the transportation design.

Q: Does the Project Manager need to be available locally on a regular basis?

A: No. The project manager does not need to be local. They need to have the availability to oversee the task.

Q: Is Section 106 Consultation being handled by the County?

A: Section 106 has been completed.

Q: Is Coast Guard, Corps and BNSF coordination being handled by the County?

A: Yes, these will be handled by Chelan County.

Q: Will SEPA and permitting be covered under a separate contract?

A: SEPA will be handled by Chelan County.

Q: Should the Prime Submittal Form be used by both Primes and Subs or is there a separate Sub Submittal Information Form that should be utilized?

A: The Prime Submittal Form can be used for both the Prime and Subs.

Q: Would the County consider any of the subcontractors on the current design team to be conflicted of helping us with the NEPA project?

A: No.
