


CRP 720 and 721: Countywide Striping & Signing Location: Throughout Chelan County

Basis for Project: Traffic safety

Construction: Summer 2019


Project Description: Chelan County Public Works collected and analyzed historic and current traffic accidents and trends to determine what safety improvements should be put in place on its roadways to help the state achieve Target Zero. In that research, the 2017 Chelan County Road Safety Plan identified lane departure crashes as a top priority. As a result, the county will repaint road edge lines throughout the county — increasing them from 4 to 6 inches — and install curve warning signs on Mission Creek Road (mp 4.77 to 8.00) and on Stemilt Loop Road (mp 0.0 to 8.78).

Status: Project is scheduled to be advertised in March 2019, with bid openings in April. Sign installation is scheduled for summer 2019 and striping in fall 2019.

Traffic Impacts: Striping will take place on most major collectors (see vicinity map to the left). Signing will be on Mission Creek and Stemilt Loop roads. No traffic impacts expected.



Motorists use pavement markings to help guide them along a roadway. Increasing the width of the markings is one way to increase their visibility (right). Curve warning signs also alert drivers to take precautions when approaching curves. Both photos are from the recent road safety improvements made along the Chumstick Highway by Chelan County.
