Notice to Chelan County Irrigators: Irrigation Water on Roadways

Chelan County would like to call your attention to a problem that arises when irrigation systems generate ongoing, frequent watering within the county right-of-way because of improper watering techniques, including adjusting sprinkler heads, using back screens, and/or a lack of proper maintenance.

Excess water within the right-of-way contributes to erosion and damage to the road system and downstream properties. Water saturates the road bed and eventually causes potholes and shoulder collapse, reducing the life of the roadway and creating safety concerns for drivers, bicyclists and pedestrians. Rough roadways can also be problematic when hauling your fruit to the warehouse.

In extreme conditions, excess water on the roadway may even cause sloughing of the roadway or landslides onto private property. The county requests your assistance in alleviating drainage problems by operating and maintaining your irrigation system in an efficient and effective manner.
