Road Vacation for Boleslaw/Jagla Road – Paul Volkmann

County Engineer Jolene Gosselin presents County Engineer's Report regarding the platted roadway on the continued hearing from October 9, 2007. Report is discussed and easements of the road reflected in the hearing are outlined. It is the finding of the Chelan County Engineer that the portion of the right of way as petitioned for vacation is not necessary for the county road system today, but may be a requirement for future developments of the area. If the right of way is vacated a request is made that a utility easement be preserved.

9:49:30 AM PUBLIC COMMENT:

Paul Volkmann, petitioner, speaks on the action requested, driveways, and roadways and the possible utilities mentioned in the September 27 letter submitted by the PUD.

Kevin Gates also speaks on the right of way dedicated in 1912 which is 10-12 feet wide. He states that constructing a 20' road on the side slope of the hill would be very difficult and

quite costly. There are no utilities on the line except at the junction. Any sale of his property would require the establishments of easements. He believes Lovitt property has three access points off of Squilchuck Road. This area as well as below this area are going to need a road system. He is in favor of the vacation. He is in favor of development and does not feel this is a critical tie into the piece of land.

Commissioner Hawkins asks the applicant to state the reason for the petition and Mr. Paul Volkmann responds that he is requesting the vacation to limit the access through his property. His brother also has his home located on the corner of the access in the platted map which would be affected.

Loren Brown, as President of the Lovitt Mine speaks, on behalf of the Lovitt Mining Corporation. A previous vacation hearing was held before the Commissioners in 2002 for Mr. Kevin Gates for vacation of the northern, lower end of the platted roadway and it was agreed prior to the vacation that access to the Lovitt property would be retained from above as the perfect access point to the property. Mr. Brown states the amount of improvement would be minor on the current platted road with only about 40 feet that is not according to county grade. The current county road right of way is the best access to the property. He feels that it is not feasible to build a road from Squilchuck Road on the westerly boundary of the property due to the cost but minimal work would be required to access from the upper county road right of way and only one area of grading would be required. The legality of vacating a road easement is discussed.

Jim Volkmann speaks on the issue. The name of his mother Helen Volkmann, is not on the documents and his name is also not listed on the documents. She was the first owner. Mr. Jim Volkmann states the county vacated that section of the road when they placed their home on the property in 1991. He states he could not get a loan for the home until the road was vacated.

Kelli Volkmann also speaks on the recording of the right of way. It was her understanding that the bank pursued the vacation when they placed the home on the land which was required by the lending institution. She did not however, attend a vacation hearing. County Engineer Jolene Gosselin states the records show a vacation was recorded. Mr. Jim Volkmann speaks of utilities, mostly water and irrigation in the area. His irrigation line crosses that road three times.

Kim Shiflett speaks of the Jagla Road and the driving in the winter. She states she would not want to see any more traffic on that road due to the road being very steep. She drives the road every day. It is a very dangerous road. It would be a safer access from the Squilchuck Road side.

Paul Mayers, listing agent for the Lovitt Mining speaks in reference to the Lovitt property for which they are under contract with a developer on that property that could potentially be

landlocked. This is the most viable access to the property. It would devalue the property to change the value significantly. The property currently is zoned 20 acres.

Commissioner Hawkins is not in favor of vacating a road as a way of denying development. It is currently zoned as R20 and there is no guarantee and is now set up as one dwelling per 20 acres. Commissioner Hawkins does not believe that a road vacation hearing is the proper venue to discuss the pros and cons of development.

Mr. Paul Volkmann understands the cost of construction for a road would be the responsibility of the owner and the maintenance of the road would be the responsibility of the county. That would be a large expense to maintain that road.

Carol Standerfer, if there is other access is available why would they not use that access as opposed to wiping out her rental house.

The location of the right of way of the platted road would need to be established. Mr. Brown was granted an easement of the lower road in 2002 from the north, subject to granting easement and access to Lovitt. He agrees with Mr. Volkann that the road needs to be in a different location but feels that looking at the old charts and maps that it was originally in a different location and may bypass Jagla Road altogether away from the platted location.

Ray Standerford asks how the County can vacate a portion of a road. Commissioner Hawkins states that the vacation is from one defined point to another defined point and that a portion can be vacated. A vacation is filed by petition, typically by the owner of the property where the road is located, and that is what is considered in the vacation.

Kim Shiflett questions that if Lovitt needs to make access from Squilchuck for the other properties why don't they continue the access to that property. Commissioner Goehner states this is not a unique situation to vacate a road that has not been developed but is platted.

Paul Mayers states that this is a question of elevation and cost to build a road from the bottom. The previous vacation was agreed to as long as easement was provided on the upper portion of the road. The other issue is cost to put in a road from the bottom. There is a legal County platted right of way.

A letter is entered into the record from Jeffers, Danielson, Sonn and Aylward, Attorneys for the petitioner.

Bob Bugert affirms that the land trust is here for the long haul and states this is a great opportunity for an update on the trails systems. Acquisition is not the tool of choice but conservation is a more appropriate tool and other tools that are more appropriate are available.
