By mail

In-person

Accessible Voting



Chelan County Elections is committed to ensuring that all voters have the opportunity to vote a private and secure ballot.

Accessible Voting Units (AVU's) are available starting 18 days before an Election, until 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

An AVU is a voting assistance unit that enables voters with visual impairments, cognitive/learning disabilities, illiteracy, or limited mobility to vote independently and privately.

An AVU presents your ballot on a monitor, you select choices by touching a screen, using a select wheel, or by using a tool. You can use headphones to listen to the text and prompts on your ballot. AVU's can also be fitted with sip-and-puff tools. AVU's are wheelchair accessible and screened from others to maintain privacy.



If I am a victim of a crime, can I vote safely?

Keep your voting address confidential

You may be able to enroll in the Address Confidentiality Program (ACP) and register as a Protected Records Voter if you are:

- A survivor of domestic violence, sexual assault, trafficking, stalking; or
- A criminal justice participant, election official, or protected health care worker who is a target for harassment.

To become a Protected Records Voter:

- You meet with a Certified Advocate who can assist with threat assessment, safety planning, and the program application.
- The best time to enroll is when you move or are planning to move to a location that is unknown to the offender and undocumented in public record.

Felony conviction?

Your right to vote is restored when you are no longer serving a sentence of total confinement in prison.



You must re-register to vote in order to receive a ballot.




While the Elections Office is continually updating the voter rolls with information from the Department of Licensing, the post office, local obituaries and a monthly public health deceased list, you can do your part by following these simple steps:

- Update your address with the Elections Office whenever it changes. Address changes can be made online through www.VoteWA.gov, by email, mail or phone until 5:00 p.m. July 29. You may update your registration in-person through Election Day, August 6 at 8:00 p.m.
- If you are a snowbird or a college student, email or call to set up a seasonal or temporary mailing address.
- Return to Sender! If you receive a ballot for a person who does not live at your residence, write "Does not live here" on the unopened envelope and put it back in the mail.
- If you receive a ballot for a recently deceased voter, write "Deceased" on the unopened envelope and put it back in the mail. We will research and follow up.

PROPOSITION NO. 1

Authorization of Benefit Charge

Ballot Title

Shall the Wenatchee Valley Fire Department composed of (Chelan County FPD No. 1 and Douglas County FPD No. 2) be authorized to impose benefit charges each year for six years, not to exceed an amount equal to sixty percent of its operating budget, and be prohibited from imposing an additional property tax under RCW 52.26.140(1)(c)?

Explanatory Statement

Wenatchee Valley Fire Department “WVFD” is responsible for providing fire protection and emergency medical services in your community. The WVFD is currently funded by a property tax levy of up to \$1.50 per thousand of assessed value.

This measure if approved by the voters would reduce WVFD’s maximum property tax levy to \$1.00 per thousand of assessed value and would authorize a benefit charge to fund up to 60% of the WVFD operating budget for an initial six year period. Extension of the benefit charge beyond the initial six year period will require additional voter approval.

A benefit charge is not a property tax. The benefit charge is a user fee designed to allocate the cost of the services provided by WVFD in reasonable proportion to the measurable benefit a property receives. The benefit charge is based on an industry accepted formula that takes into consideration fire flows, the square footage of structures, the type of structures and various risk factors.

The WVFD Governance Board has determined that permanently establishing the benefit charge will provide a more stable, reliable and cost effective method for financing the operations of WVFD and for maintaining satisfactory levels of service.

Statement in Favor

A fire benefit charge would take a fair and balanced approach, as opposed to the ever increasing changes in assessed valuations. Under a fire benefit charge, you pay according to the size, risks, and hazards of the building on your property. Residential homes pay less than higher risk industrial and commercial buildings. This is because it takes fewer firefighters and fire engines to put out a fire in a house compared to a large commercial structure. I want to pay the appropriate fire protection for my needs. Vote yes on Proposition 1.

Proposition No. 1

Property Tax Levy for Fire Protection and Emergency Medical Services

Ballot Title

The Board of Chelan County Fire Protection District No. 5 adopted Resolution No. 06 concerning a proposition to maintain and adequately fund District operations.

This proposition authorizes the District to restore its regular property tax levy to \$.75 per \$1,000 of assessed value to be assessed in 2024 and collected in 2025. The funds will maintain and improve fire protection and emergency medical services, replace apparatus, equipment and facilities and provide for firefighter safety. The maximum allowable levy in 2024 shall serve as the base for subsequent levy limitations as provided by chapter 84.55 RCW.

Explanatory Statement

Chelan County Fire Protection District No. 5 provides emergency fire protection and emergency medical services to its citizens. Due to the statutory 1% limitation on property tax increases, the Fire District's current levy has dropped to approximately \$.41 per thousand in 2023. The maximum regular levy rate for Washington fire districts is \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed value.

If approved by the voters, this proposition will authorize the District to restore its levy rate to \$.75 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for collection in 2025 which is lower than the \$.89 rate previously approved by the voters in 2014. The dollar amount levied in the 2024 year shall serve as the District's future tax levy base.

The Board of Commissioners has determined that this proposition is necessary to maintain an effective level of services, fire fighter staffing, equipment and facilities in light of rising costs, rising demands and the continued growth of our community. Approval of this measure will allow the District to maintain the level of fire protection and emergency medical services provided to its citizens and provide for firefighter safety.

Statement in Favor

The primary reasons for supporting Chelan County Fire District #5's *Ballot Measure #1* are the increased growth and wildfire risks in the Manson community. Funds from the replacement levy- not a new tax - would simply: purchase equipment; improve buildings and upgrade facilities; hire and train staff; plus, keep pace with inflation of operational expenses.

Manson Fire District #5 enjoys an all-volunteer team that puts its life on the line whenever you call 911 for fires, EMT medical emergencies, auto accidents and water rescues. They are excellent because of the professional training they receive, the equipment they operate, and their vehicles designed for our community. They respond to more than 100 fire-related calls, protect us from raging wildfires, and 500 EMS emergencies each year. The next could be yours.

Conclusion: Supporting the fire levy is not a financial decision. It's a commitment to the safety and well-being of every resident- and a necessary step to protect us in the future. However, if the ballot measure fails, the results would be catastrophic!

During an election, track your ballot at www.VoteWA.gov. The ballot status will update as your ballot is received. Please allow 3-5 business days for your ballot status to be posted.

Ballot Status Categories:

Sent - Ballot has been marked as sent by the county (date may be in the future).

Accepted - Signature review has been completed, the voter has been credited with voting, and the ballot is accepted.

Rejection/Challenged + Challenged Reason - Signature or ballot has been challenged. The Chelan County Elections Office will contact the voter.

Challenge Reasons:

These challenge codes require action by the voter. The voter will be contacted by the Chelan County Elections Office.

Unsigned - The voter did not sign the declaration on the outside of the return envelope.

Signature Does Not Match - The signature on the return envelope does not match signature on file.


ID Required - The voter registration has failed the ID check and must provide ID before the ballot can be counted.

Power of Attorney - A Power of Attorney has signed the declaration on behalf of the voter. This is *not allowed* for voting purposes.

The status for this code could change during processing.

Hold - Voter returned a previously issued ballot that has been superseded. If the ballot returned is the same ballot style as the current ballot, it will be counted. If different ballot style, the ballot must be held until 7 days after Election Day.

Signature Verification Requirement and Cure Process

Sometimes signatures change. If that is the case, don't worry! We will send you a form to update your signature. If we have a phone number on file for you, we will also call you to remind you to return your form. Need a reminder of what signature we have for you? Take a look at your Driver's License. Many people register to vote when they apply/renew their Driver's License, so that is the signature we would have on file for you.

Chelan County Elections employees are trained in signature verification. They compare your signature on the return envelope to the signature we have on file for you.

Signature challenges occur when a voter does not sign the back of the ballot return envelope or when the signature on the return envelope does not match the signature(s) in their voter registration record. Any voter with a signature challenge can fix the issue and have their ballot counted by filling out and returning a form to Chelan County Elections before the day the election results are certified.

If you would like to update your signature for future elections, simply scan the QR Code to print a voter registration form. You can mail the form back to us at the address listed on the form.
