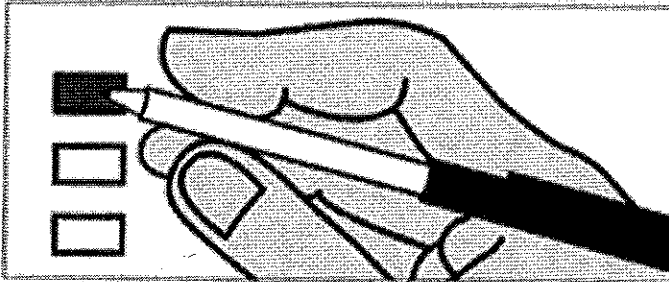

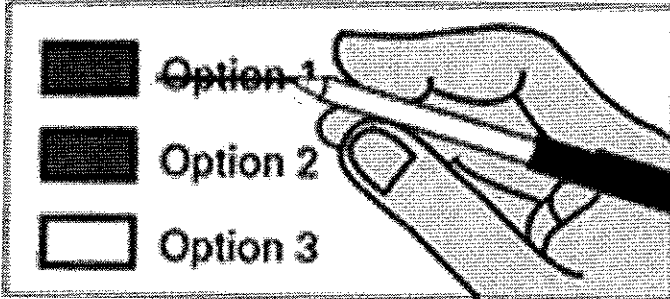

REPLACEMENT CAPITAL LEVY FOR EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY AND SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS

The Board of Directors of Lake Chelan School District No. 129 adopted Resolution No. 2023-7, concerning a proposition to finance educational technology and safety improvements. This proposition would authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, replacing an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District to continue funding student and teacher technology devices, equipment and infrastructure and school safety and security improvements, all to improve the student learning environment:

Proposition No. 1

Property Tax Levy for Fire Protection and Emergency Medical Services

The Board of Lake Wenatchee Fire & Rescue adopted Resolution No. 2023-10 concerning a proposition to maintain and adequately fund District operations.

This proposition authorizes the District to establish its regular property tax levy at \$.95 per \$1,000 of assessed value to be assessed in 2024 and collected in 2025. The funds will maintain and improve fire protection, emergency medical services and facilities, replace apparatus and equipment, and provide for firefighter safety. The maximum allowable levy in 2024 shall serve as the base for subsequent levy limitations as provided by chapter 84.55 RCW.
