Sign Your Ballot!

Sign and date your return envelope in order for your ballot to be counted!



Return your ballot by mail.

No Stamp Needed!

We strongly recommend returning your ballot as early as possible. Mailed ballots must be postmarked by April 23rd.



Return your ballot at a drop box.

Ballot drop boxes are open until 8:00 p.m. sharp on April 23rd.

Ballot Drop Boxes

For this election, there are 4 drop boxes open starting April 5th. They close promptly at 8:00 p.m. on April 23, 2024 Election Night.

Sometimes signatures change. If that is the case, don't worry! We will send you a form to update your signature. If we have a phone number on file for you, we will also call you to remind you to return your form. Need a reminder of what signature we have for you? Take a look at your Driver's License. Many people register to vote when they apply/renew their Driver's License, so that is the signature we would have on file for you.



Chelan County Elections employees are trained in signature verification. They compare your signature on the return envelope to the signature we have on file for you.

Signature challenges occur when a voter does not sign the back of the ballot return envelope or when the signature on the return envelope does not match the signature(s) in their voter registration record. Any voter with a signature challenge can fix the issue and have their ballot counted by filling out and returning a form to Chelan County Elections before the day the election results are certified.

Manson Parks and Recreation District

Proposition No. 1

Will the Manson Park and Recreation District be authorized to impose regular property tax levies of \$0.23 or less per thousand dollars of assessed valuation for each of three consecutive years, 2025, 2026, and 2027?

Explanatory Statement

Manson Park and Recreation District was formed in 1971 and includes Willow Point Park, Old Swim Hole, Manson Bay Park, Manson Bay Marina, Leffler Field, Singleton, Old Mill Boat Launch, and Wapato Lake Campground. Maintenance and operations ("M&O") funding comes primarily from user fees and voterapproved property tax dollars. Tax revenue is utilized per RCW 36.69.130 for facilities, equipment maintenance, and other recreation functions. Grants primarily fund Capital Improvements and acquisitions.

In 2021, voters passed the 2022-2024 levy by 75%, at a rate up to twenty-three cents per \$1,000 of assessed property value. The rate collected in 2022 and 2023 averaged fifteen and one-half cents; in 2019-2021, the average was sixteen cents.

Manson Parks is asking voters to consider the 2025-2027 levy proposal, costing voters up to twenty-three cents per \$1,000 of assessed valuation. This amount is well below the statutory limit of sixty cents per \$1,000 of assessed valuation, and is the same factor passed on the previous levy. RCW Chapter 84.55 limits future increases. A portion of the funding may be designated for planned replacement of infrastructure and facilities. Voter approval must be at least 60 percent.
