PATEROS SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 122-70J **EDUCATIONAL AND INFRASTRUCTURE**

The Board of Directors of Pateros School District No. 122-70J adopted Resolution No. 264 concerning a proposition to finance health, safety, educational and infrastructure improvements. This proposition would authorize the District to make health, safety, educational and infrastructure improvements to Pateros School (including upgrading health and safety systems at core building and grounds; renovating CTE metals and vocational agriculture building; constructing a new multipurpose building; and providing

transportation/maintenance bays); issue no more than \$7,250,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 20 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 264.
