Accessible Voting



Chelan County Elections is committed to ensuring that all voters have the opportunity to vote a private and secure ballot.

Accessible Voting Units (AVU's) are available starting 18 days before an Election, until 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

An AVU is a voting assistance unit that enables voters with visual impairments, cognitive/learning disabilities, illiteracy, or limited mobility to vote independently and privately.

An AVU presents your ballot on a monitor, you select choices by touching a screen, using a select wheel, or by using a tool. You can use headphones to listen to the text and prompts on your ballot. AVU's can also be fitted with sip-and-puff tools. AVU's are wheelchair accessible and screened from others to maintain privacy.



If I am a victim of a crime, can I vote safely?

Keep your voting address confidential

You may be able to enroll in the Address Confidentiality Program (ACP) and register as a Protected Records Voter if you are:

- · A survivor of domestic violence, sexual assault, trafficking, stalking; or
- · A criminal justice participant, election official, or protected health care worker who is a target for harassment.


To become a Protected Records Voter:

- You meet with a Certified Advocate who can assist with threat assessment, safety planning, and the program application.
- The best time to enroll is when you move or are planning to move to a location that is unknown to the offender and undocumented in public record.





Vote your ballot ...

Use a blue or black ink pen to mark your ballot.

You may leave a contest blank, your ballot will still count.

Put your voted ballot in the security sleeve.

Put the security sleeve in the return envelope.

Seal the return envelope.

Sign and date the declaration on the return envelope. If you are unable to sign, make your mark and have it witnessed by TWO people. *Ensure that both people sign the envelope.*

A power of attorney cannot be used to sign a ballot.

Place your ballot in a ballot drop box . . .

Deposit your ballot in a drop box. Drop boxes are picked up by Elections department staff, not the USPS. See drop box locations on page 3.

Drop boxes are open 18 days before Election Day. They remain open 24 hours a day until 8:00 p.m. Election Night. Chelan County strongly encourages using drop boxes.

Or return your ballot by mail ...

NO STAMP required if mailed in the U.S.

Ballots sent by USPS **MUST** be postmarked no later than Election Day, November 4. The USPS recommends that you mail a week before Election Day.



The proposed \$73 million bond for Lake Chelan School District raises serious financial and community concerns. While the district claims the funds are necessary, the reality is that local taxpayers will bear a heavy burden. For many homeowners, this bond would mean hundreds of dollars more per year in taxes, a tough hit for families already struggling with rising costs.

Even more troubling is that the bond is being requested despite weak academic results. State statistics show Lake Chelan schools perform below the state average in math and have seen graduation rates stagnate. A new building will not solve these issues. Academics should be the primary focus of schools. According to industry-standard and national school construction data, the most pressing needs at Morgen Owings Elementary could be addressed for far less, and historic value preserved. Roof and plumbing repairs, a new track, soccer field drainage, ADA upgrades, shop renovations, and other updates could all be completed at a fraction of the district's \$73 million price tag. Given the facts, it is difficult to justify such a massive tax increase. The district should focus on academics and budgeting, and citizens deserve accountability before committing to higher taxes.


- Update your address with the Elections Office whenever it changes. Address changes can be made online through www.VoteWA.gov, by email, mail or phone until 5:00 p.m. October 27. You may update your registration in-person until 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.
- If you are a snowbird or a college student, email or call to set up a seasonal or temporary mailing address.
- Return to Sender! If you receive a ballot for a person who
 does not live at your residence, write "Does not live here"
 on the unopened envelope and put it back in the mail.
- If you receive a ballot for a recently deceased voter, write "Deceased" on the unopened envelope and put it back in the mail. We will research and follow up.



Tips to Ensure Your Ballot is Counted

- **1.** Sign in the signature box that has **your name** printed on the envelope.
- **2.** If you registered to vote online, or when you obtained your driver's license, the signature on your driver's license is the signature in your voter registration record.
- **3.** If you are unsure about the signature in your voter registration record, we encourage you to call the Elections Office at (509) 667-6808. We can provide a description of the signature you used when you registered to vote.
- **4. Do not** sign someone else's name, even if you have power of attorney.
- **5.** Voting over the phone by having someone else fill out and sign your ballot **is against the law**. Voters can call at (509) 667-6808 to learn about the options for voting while they are out of town.
- **6.** Drop boxes are available if you don't want your signature to go through the mail. See "Ballot Drop Box Locations" on page 3 for a list of open drop boxes.





Signature Verification Requirement and Cure Process

Sometimes signatures change. If that is the case, don't worry! We will send you a form to update your signature. If we have a phone number on file for you, we will also call you to remind you to return your form. Need a reminder of what signature we have for you? Take a look at your Driver's License. Many people register to vote when they apply/renew their Driver's License, so that is the signature we would have on file for you.



Chelan County Elections employees are trained in signature verification. They compare your signature on the return envelope to the signature we have on file for you.

Signature challenges occur when a voter does not sign the back of the ballot return envelope or when the signature on the return envelope does not match the signature(s) in their voter registration record. Any voter with a signature challenge can fix the issue and have their ballot counted by filling out and returning a form to Chelan County Elections before the day the election results are certified.

If you would like to update your signature for future elections, simply scan the QR Code to print a voter registration form. You can mail the form back to us at the address listed on the form.





CHECK YOUR BALLOT STATUS:

www.VoteWA.gov

During an election, track your ballot at www.VoteWA.gov. The ballot status will update as your ballot is received. Please allow 3-5 business days for your ballot status to be posted.

Ballot Status Categories:

Sent - Ballot has been marked as sent by the county (date may be in the future).

Accepted - Signature review has been completed, the voter has been credited with voting, and the ballot is accepted.

Rejection/Challenged + Challenged Reason - Signature or ballot has been challenged. The Chelan County Elections Office will contact the voter.

Challenge Reasons:

These challenge codes require action by the voter. The voter will be contacted by the Chelan County Elections Office.

Unsigned - The voter did not sign the declaration on the outside of the return envelope.

Signature Does Not Match - The signature on the return envelope does not match signature on file.

ID Required - The voter registration has failed the ID check and must provide ID before the ballot can be counted.

Power of Attorney - A Power of Attorney has signed the declaration on behalf of the voter. This is *not allowed* for voting purposes.

The status for this code could change during processing.

Hold - Voter returned a previously issued ballot that has been superseded. If the ballot returned is the same ballot style as the current ballot, it will be counted. If different ballot style, the ballot must be held until 7 days after Election Day.


How are ballots processed?

- Ballots sent through the US Postal Service are delivered from the post office by postal worker and brought directly to the Elections Office.
- Ballot drop boxes are emptied by two elections staff. Ballots are placed in sealed containers and brought to the Elections Office.
- Ballot envelopes are scanned and signatures are verified.
- The signature on each envelope is matched to the signature in the voter's registration record.
- If the signature matches it is marked as "accepted."
- If the signature is missing or doesn't match it is marked as "rejected." Voters are mailed a letter with a ballot declaration to cure the issue. This declaration must be returned with a signature matching to the signature on the ballot envelope for the ballot to move forward in the process.
- Ballots with verified signatures are then forwarded to an election team for extraction.
- The secrecy sleeves are removed from the outer envelope, separating the ballot from the voter's information on the envelope.
- Ballots are then removed from the secrecy sleeves.
- Ballots are inspected for physical damage or other potential scanning issues, such as white-out or tears.
- If a ballot is unable to be scanned, an election team will duplicate the ballot. An audit of all duplicated ballots is performed by a different election team.
- Ballots are scanned, prepared for tabulation and securely stored.
- A Random Batch Audit is completed within 48 hours after Election Day. Up to 6 batches are randomly selected and a race is chosen. All batches are hand counted and compared to the results tabulated by the machine to ensure the equipment is tabulating properly.
- Vote totals are calculated beginning at 8 p.m. on Election Night. Ballots with valid postmarks will continue to be processed and tabulated up until the day before certification.

How do I cast a ballot?




Your ballot will be mailed no later than 18-20 days before the election to the address you provided in your voter registration. If you need a replacement ballot, contact your county elections office.






Vote your ballot and sign your return envelope. You are not required to vote every race on your ballot. We encourage using this pamphlet to help you decide.



Return your ballot to an official ballot drop box. Drop boxes are open until 8 p.m. on election night.




Or return your ballot by mail, no stamp needed. If mailed, your ballot must be postmarked by election day. A late postmark could disqualify your ballot. The USPS recommends that you mail a week before Election Day.





If you cannot personally return your ballot, only let people you trust deliver it for you.







Election staff will contact you before your ballot is processed if:

- Your signature is missing
- Your signature doesn't match your voter registration record

Online

You can register online, 24 hours a day, at VoteWA.gov. To register in time to vote in the General Election, register online by October 27.



By mail

Download and print a registration form from VoteWA.gov and mail to Chelan County Elections. It must be received by October 27.



In-person

You can register to vote in-person at the Chelan County Elections Office through **Election Day, November 4.** More information about our office hours and location can be found on page 3 of this pamphlet.
