

On July 6, road crews will chip seal in two locations on Chumstick Highway. The lower portion is about a mile long and the second portion is about 3 miles long.

In both work areas, there will be a reduced speed limit of 35 mph. Traffic will be at one lane, with a pilot car leading vehicles through the work zone. Flaggers also will be on site.

After chip sealing, the roadway will have loose gravel until crews return to broom the roadway. Brooming occurs two to three days after chip seal to allow the road to cure. Motorists traveling on a recently chip-sealed road should drive at a reduced speed limit and maintain a safe distance behind other motorists.
